In this study we explore which COVID19 vaccine characteristics and implementation features are most important to UKZN staff and students, particularly those with vaccine hesitancy. We propose to conduct a survey and discrete choice experiment to identify the relative importance of vaccine characteristics and implementation strategies to determine how best to design vaccination programs aligned with staff and student preferences to ensure maximal uptake, lessons which could be applied to higher education institutions throughout South Africa.

What is involved in the interview?


The online survey will take around 15 minutes to complete. The first portion of the survey will ask questions about your demographic characteristics, employment and COVID-19 experiences. The second portion of the survey will be a Discrete Choice Experiment (DCE), where participants will be asked to compare two COVID-19 vaccination scenarios, across 8 DCE questions, and select the option you prefer the most.


Risks and benefits

Study approval

Confidentiality

The researchers will safeguard any information obtained during this study and make every effort to keep it confidential. All information collected from you during the interview will be available only to the study staff at the University of KwaZulu-Natal and Washington University in St. Louis, and if necessary the UKZN Biomedical Research Ethics Committee. We may only share your information if we are legally required by authorities. Your name will not appear on the research forms or any of the reports. Instead, a unique study participant number will be assigned to you and used to identify your forms. A separate list will be generated with staff and student numbers of those eligible for the R500 draw. This list will not be connected to the study number will be stored separately in a password-protected file.

Voluntary participation and right to withdraw

Your participation in this study is voluntary. You may choose to end your participation in the study at any time if you wish.
